

This publication is part of the efforts of TDAP to share details and showcase Pakistan's products and services in international markets.








PRODUCT PROFILE

Pakistan has enormous wealth of expensive gems such as ruby, emerald, tourmaline, garnet, topaz, peridot, aquamarine, spinel, pargasite, diopside, moonstone, pink topaz, sapphire, zircon, feldspar, agate, serpentine jade, epidote, pink beryl (morganite), purple beryl, sphene, zoisite, lapis lazuli, turquoise, and kunzite etc. Pakistan has vast natural reserves of precious and semi-precious gemstones, cheap labour and rich tradition of craftsmanship in jewellery manufacturing, the government gave this sector the status of industry. The 222 million of population represent huge market size of economy but due to untapped potentials bulk of jewellery is imported or smuggled from India and China, which is an obstacle in the protection of domestic industry.

Pakistan has the 5th largest gemstone reserves with 800,000 carats of Ruby, 87,000 carats of Emerald and 5 million carats of Peridot. Despite the fact that our exports are insignificant compared to that of the potential, yet it is worth mentioning that our export of gems and jewelry rose from US \$14.1 million in 2018 to US \$14.6 million in 2019. However, gemologists believe that the revenue generated from the sector are just peanuts compared to its huge potential, as more than 80 percent of the revenue came from unprocessed, raw gemstones.

In Pakistan the hub of gold jewelery manufacturing are Karachi and Lahore. There is dearth of skilled/semi-skilled and relatively cheap labour available in Pakistan. The gold jewellery trade in Pakistan involves a large turnover of jewellery worth million of dollars, but the drawback is that the gold jewellery industry still relies on traditional designs which can only satisfy the local demand of consumers in Pakistan.



REASONS OF INCREASE IN EXPORT

Mostly, the shipment of gold jewelry is carried by the exporters themselves or sometimes it is shipped by air cargo, however due to normalization of pandemic situation and easiness in lock downs in destination markets in 2020-21, the frequency of the said shipments has been increased and hence export is increased. It is pertinent to mention here that under Self-Consignment Scheme of SRO-760(I)/2013 about 44 shipments of locally procured gold jewelry were shipped abroad during 2020-21 and export proceeds (about USD 4.5 million) realized against these shipments.

Normalization of air cargo during 2020-21 and increase online purchasing of Gems Stones are also major factors of increase in export of gemstones.

EXPORT OF GOLD JEWELRY SECTOR OF PAKISTAN

The export of gold jewelry is entirely regulated through a government regulation called 'Import and Export of Precious Metals Jewelry and Gemstone Order 2013. According to this regulation, all exporters and importers of jewelry are required to register with the Trade Development Authority of Pakistan in order to be able to trade. Exporters of gold jewelry need to register under two different schemes namely the self-consignment and entrustment scheme. Under the self-consignment scheme, exporters procure gold from local markets to manufacture jewelry for exports and are bound to realize earnings within 120 days. 50 percent of the earnings can be shown in the form of gold and the remaining 50 percent has to be shown in the form of foreign currency. Under the entrustment scheme, 25 kg of gold can be imported in order to be exported in the form of manufactured jewelry. According to this scheme, there has to be, maximum 13 percent of value addition and 10 percent wastage. This particular legislation reveals that gold cannot be imported in the country for local use. The local gold can only be obtained from recycling gold jewelry.
